

Assistant coaches Loeffelbein, Fichter honored

Glenwood coach Barry Loeffelbein and Fremont-Mills coach Kyle Fichter have been honored with the Iowa Football Coaches Associated Assistant Coach of the Year Awards.

The IFCA announced its award last week.

Loeffelbein, the offensive coordinator for the Rams' this season, won the Class 4A award. He directed a Glenwood offense that averaged 374 yards and 35 points per game while reaching the state quarterfinals. Quarterback Kayden Anderson also set new school records this season in passing yards (2,272), touchdowns (24) and completions (137).

Loeffelbein has served as an assistant football coach at Glenwood for the past 22 years, calling plays the last five seasons.

"Barry has a calming presence every day and an ability to connect with and get along with a variety of personalities," said Glenwood head coach Cory Faust. "He has been a huge asset leading players and coaches."

Loeffelbein was surprised, honored and a maybe a little perplexed by the award. "It means a lot to have people recognize the time and effort you put into things," he said. "However, it is a bit unsettling because I know it is the whole staff that deserves recognition. The entire staff spends a great deal of time during the off-season, discussing football schemes and personnel, working to make us the best team we can be."

Loeffelbein was quick to credit the coaching staff, head coach Cory Faust and the players for the award and the Rams' success this season.

"This year's team had a tremendous season," Loeffelbein said. "I am thankful to Coach Faust for letting me be a part of it."

Fichter, who shared the Eight-player award with Woodbine's Ryan Coenen, directed a Fremont-Mills defense that was among the best in Eight-player this season.

"Coach Fichter is loved by our players, current and past," said Fremont-Mills head coach Greg Ernster. "He is the coach that will tell you like it is and also the coach that will openly admit when he has made a mistake. Never blames the kids and only wants the best for them and the program."

Fichter, who has coached at his alma mater for 26 years and served as defensive coordinator since 2005, said the award surprised him. He never got into coaching for the recognition.

"I enjoy seeing the kids develop over the years as most of them I have starting in junior high so to see them improve for six years is what I enjoy the most," Fichter said.

With eight-player football's many different formations and propensity for high-scoring games, coaching defense is always a challenge. Fichter enjoys coming up with the philosophy year after year as his personnel changes. His 2022 crew recorded two shutouts and notched 38 sacks and forced 26 turnovers.

"Our kids are always phenomenal to work with when we have to move positions and philosophies to give us the best chance to be successful as a team," he said. "Our program's consistency is what I am the most proud of."

Defense lifts Wolverines to 61-30 win

MALVERN - A slow first quarter and just a three-point halftime lead gave way to a quick, 17-0 start and a 61-30 victory for East Mills over Sidney in Corner Conference boys basketball Friday in Malvern.

The Wolverines (9-1 overall, 4-0 in the conference), coming off their first loss of the season in an ugly 59-20 setback on the road at Auburn, Neb., were slow out of the gates against as they struggled to solve the Cowboys' (3-5 overall, 1-3 in the conference) "triangle-and-two" defense. Designed to limit the touches for East Mills' leading scorers Braden West and Mason Crouse, the strategy worked early. The pair combined for seven first half points as the Wolverines took a slim 23-20 lead into intermission.

But in the third quarter, East Mills figured it out.

"We had to be a little more patient before taking that open look," said East Mills coach Kevin Schafer. "Because we knew we're going to get that open look at any time with those other three guys. So, we wanted to be patient and get an even better shot and make them work on defense instead of five seconds and a shot and we're back on defense."

The Wolverines hit four straight shots out of halftime - including an emphatic dunk by West - and went on a 17-0 run to take a 40-20 lead with 2:21 to go in the frame. Nearly every bucket came off a steal or a missed shot leading to instant offense on a fast break opportunity.

"We talked at halftime about playing defense and rebounding so we could get out in transition," Schafer said. "It helped us (Braedon) Godfread got in foul trouble. He's probably their most consistent offensive player and he gives them some length. So, him being out definitely helped us."

Godfread picked up his fourth foul midway through the third and did not return until the

fourth quarter. But it was too little too late. East Mills outscored the Cowboys 22-1 in the frame.

"We cut into open gaps better in the second

half and we got some easy layups and some 15-footers when we couldn't take the three,"

East Mills rallies late in win over Sidney

MALVERN - They trailed for all of three quarters.

But you couldn't see that on the East Mills players' faces.

The Wolverines trailed by as many nine points and didn't snag their first lead until a minute remained in the third quarter in a 54-51 win over Sidney in Corner Conference girls basketball Friday in Malvern.

"That first quarter was kind of a wake up call," said East Mills coach Lexi Moreno after the game. "That first quarter it didn't look like it was going to go our way."

The Wolverines trailed by four after the first quarter after allowing 23 points and committing nine turnovers.

"We were playing lazy, not getting back and let mistakes get to us," Moreno said. "After the quarter I told the girls we had to stick together and communicate and I think that really helped us tonight."

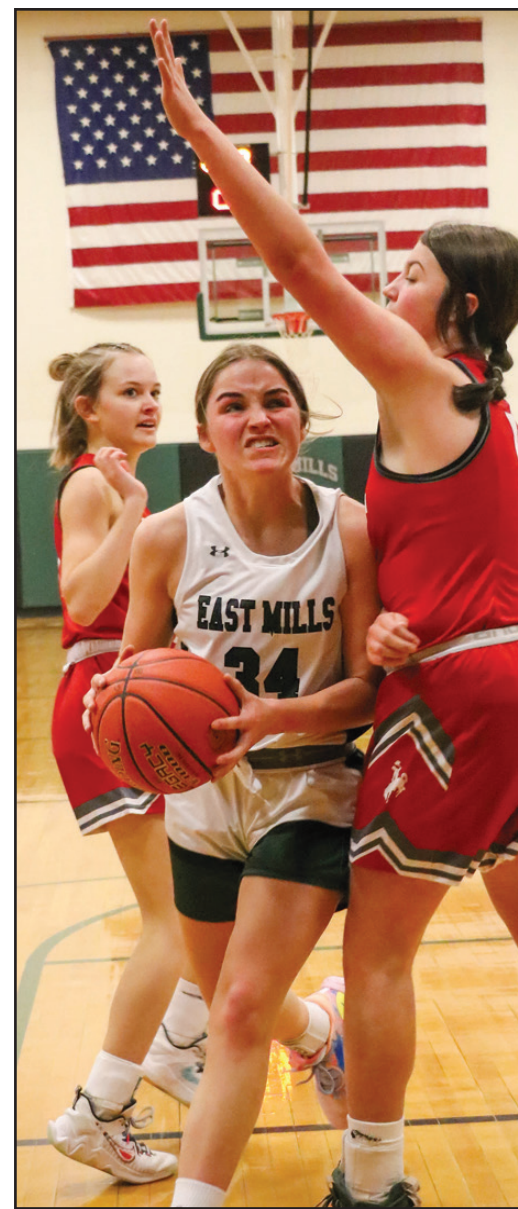
East Mills kept battling, never allowing the Cowgirls to pull away. Back-to-back buckets by Emily Williams helped the Wolverines take their first lead of the game at 40-38 with just over a minute to go in the third quarter.

The two teams would trade leads five times in the fourth before East Mills wrestled control away. A layup by Natalie Goodman and a free throw by Miah Urban gave the Wolverines a 52-49 lead with 1:48 to go. Aunika Hayes' layup with :41 to go would cut it 52-51 but that's as close as the Cowgirls would get.

Goodman hit two free throws with :22 to go and Avery Dowling's three-point heave as time expired would ice the win for East Mills.

The biggest changeup for the Wolverines in the win was Moreno pulling her team out of the full court pressure they opened the game in and switching to an aggressive half-court man-to-man that forced 20 turnovers and held Sidney to 38.8 percent shooting.

"Games like these, they're gut checks in the first quarter," Moreno said. "We had to be physical and talk. That's what works for us. That's going to get us wins. We really believe in that, and they believed in it."

Rams crown three at Rollin Dyer invite

Glenwood's Vinny Mayberry, C.J. Carter and Mason Koehler all won their weight classes and the Rams finished third as a team at the Rollin Dyer Wrestling Invitational Saturday in Atlantic Saturday.

The Rams had four wrestlers reach the finals and tallied 138 points to tie Humboldt for third place. Bondurant-Farrar was the team champion with 227.5 points.

"The kids wrestled well," said Glenwood coach Tucker Weber. "This was the second toughest tournament we wrestled at after the Council Bluffs Classic. There was a lot of good competition. Having four guys reach the finals was a standout for us and they all wrestled really well in the finals."

The Rams' Mayberry, the No. 8 ranked 120-pounder in the state, swept into the finals where he pinned Grand Island's No. 10 ranked Madden Kontos in the first period to win his bracket. Carter and Koehler were equally dominant in winning their weight classes.

Koehler knocked off Class 1A No. 3 ranked Evan Foreman of Interstate 35 in the semifinals then notched a 4-2 victory over Atlantic's Miles Mundorf in the 220-pound finals and Carter, who entered the day ranked No. 3 in the state, scored a 7-1 decision over New Hampton's Braden McShane in the finals to win his bracket.

"All three of the guys who won their titles had some tough matches and wrestled well," Weber said.

The Rams' Trent Patton, who is currently ranked No. 11, also reached the finals at 285 but suffered a tough 3-2 loss to Grand Island's Zachary Pittman in the finals to finish second.
