

Rams second at own Glenwood Invitational

The Glenwood wrestling team had seven wrestlers reach the finals and the Rams placed second in the team standings at the Glenwood Wrestling Invitational Saturday.

The Rams' C.J. Carter and Tate Mayberry both won their weight classes and they added five runner up finishes in the tournament featuring 13 teams from Iowa, Nebraska and Missouri.

Carlisle, with seven individual championships, was the overall team champ with 296.5 points.

The Rams' 195-pound C.J. Carter and 152-pound Tate Mayberry both

picked up individual titles at the tournament. And both had "big" weekends, according to Weber.

Carter avenged a pair of early season losses to Harlan's top ranked Zane Bendorf with a thrilling 3-2 win in the finals.

"That was an exciting match to end the day," Weber said.

The two went scoreless in the first period before Bendorf scored a take-down only to see Carter battle back for a reversal and the 3-2 lead right at the end of the period. The senior was then able to get the two-minute ride-out to close out the match.

"They're No. 1 and No. 2 in the state and they wrestled like it," Weber added.

Mayberry, who has shaken off a knee injury that slowed him to start the season, pinned his way into the finals where he faced Carlisle's Zach Streeter. Mayberry quickly built a big lead and had to hold off a late rally with reversal in the third period to score the 15-9 victory.

"He almost had him pinned a couple times but he really wrestled well," Weber said. "He's coming off

Strong second half carries Glenwood to win

Glenwood got after Plattsmouth defensively in the second half and turned a 27-22 halftime lead into a 69-48 blowout victory at the Mid-American Shootout in Council Bluffs Saturday.

The Rams upped their defensive pressure in the second half and finally got loose in transition while opening the third quarter on a 14-7 run to lead by as many as 12. Sixteen of the Rams' 21 third quarter points all came in the paint.

"I thought we controlled the tempo pretty well," said Glenwood coach Curt Schulte. "We pushed the ball. We got the ball down low. They were in foul trouble, so we wanted to keep on punching it inside. I thought we finished better in the second half than we did the first."

All night the long the Rams were unselfish and patient on offense, getting most any shot they wanted.

"They mixed it up well and I thought we handled all their defenses well," Schulte said. "You never know after having a game the night before how your kids are going to react, and I was really proud of how they played."

The Rams outscored the Blue Devils 42-26 after halftime. They also grabbed 14 offensive rebounds, a season high.

"We didn't give them anything easy," Schulte said. "We really stressed that coming out of the locker room. We had to be better defensively and rebound the basketball and I thought we did a much better job of that."

Gage Olson, Plattsmouth's leading scorer finished with 17 points, but he had to work for every one of them against the stifling defense of Ram guard Gavin Schau. The senior harassed the guard all night long, often playing ball denial defense.

Hopp's big night leads Rams to 76-41 victory

Jenna Hopp led the Glenwood offense with a season-high 33 points, but it was the Rams' defense that proved the difference in a 76-41 win over Plattsmouth, Neb. at the Mid-America Center Shootout Saturday in Council Bluffs.

The Rams (5-2 overall, 3-1 in the Hawkeye 10 Conference) led 32-21 at the half but turned the defensive heat up a notch in the second half, pressuring and hounding the Blue Devils all over the

IHSAA considering socioeconomic factor in football classifications

The Iowa High School Athletic Association is considering an amendment to its Articles of Incorporation to include a socioeconomic factor into football classifications.

A recommendation from the IHSAA's classification committee last week to adopt a classification model similar to one currently used by the Minnesota State High School League — reducing 40 percent of a school's free or reduced lunch count from their annual enrollment to determine their final classification number — was approved by the Board of Control on Monday.

Classifications in Iowa high school athletics are currently determined solely by enrollment. If approved, the socioeconomic fac-

tor would apply to IHSAA football starting in the 2023-24 school year.

"I want to commend the IHSAA classification committee, the board of control, and the IHSAA staff for their important work on this study and resulting recommendation," IHSAA executive director Tom Keating said. "Our schools have asked us to consider socioeconomic factors in classification and the IHSAA, after much study and discussion, is pleased to offer such a strategy."

The proposed model adjusts the IHSAA classification number for all participating schools by factoring school free/reduced lunch (FRL) percentages into the state-provided BEDS (grades 9-11) enrollment.

For the IHSAA's classification number, FRL percentages must be submitted through the Department of Education or a school's BEDS en-

rollment will not receive an adjustment.

The new socioeconomic equation would reduce a school's BEDS enrollment by 40 percent of its district's FRL percentage. For example, if a school's BEDS enrollment (9-11) for the upcoming school year is 1,000 and the district's FRL percentage is 37 percent, that would reduce their IHSAA classification number to 852.

Voting by membership is expected to begin this week.

Glenwood Activities Director Jeff Bissen said he is interested to see if the proposal passes and how the numbers shake out for all schools impacted by the change. He thinks the move is a "step in the right direction with many more steps still needed for a level playing field."

"I'm excited to see the IHSAA trying to take some steps to close the gaps for schools who feel they are

not competing on a level playing field," Bissen said.

Bissen went on to say it's unclear how Glenwood will be impacted. The school is currently on the cut off line for being in Class 3A in football with last year's BEDS (student enrollment numbers) count without factoring in the latest proposal and the district's current BEDS numbers being factored in.

According to the IHSAA's press release, the board and classification committee considered numerous models and possibilities for classification over the last several years, including a two-year run as a joint committee alongside the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union. Last week's recommendation from the committee's member school administrators was the first proposing an adjustment to how school enrollments are quantified for sports clas-

sifications.

"The overwhelming majority of communication regarding concerns with competitive equity referenced football," Keating said. "Additionally, football is the only sport in which the regular season is scheduled by the IHSAA. In all other sports, individual schools, through conference affiliation or their non-conference opponents, determine their own regular season schedules. We will continue to study other sports to determine if this model should be applied."

A vote on the amendment to adopt this classification model will be sent to member schools via email. If approved, the amendment must be submitted to the Iowa State Board of Education for approval. If that is approved, the IHSAA would then implement the recommendation and model for 2023-24 football.

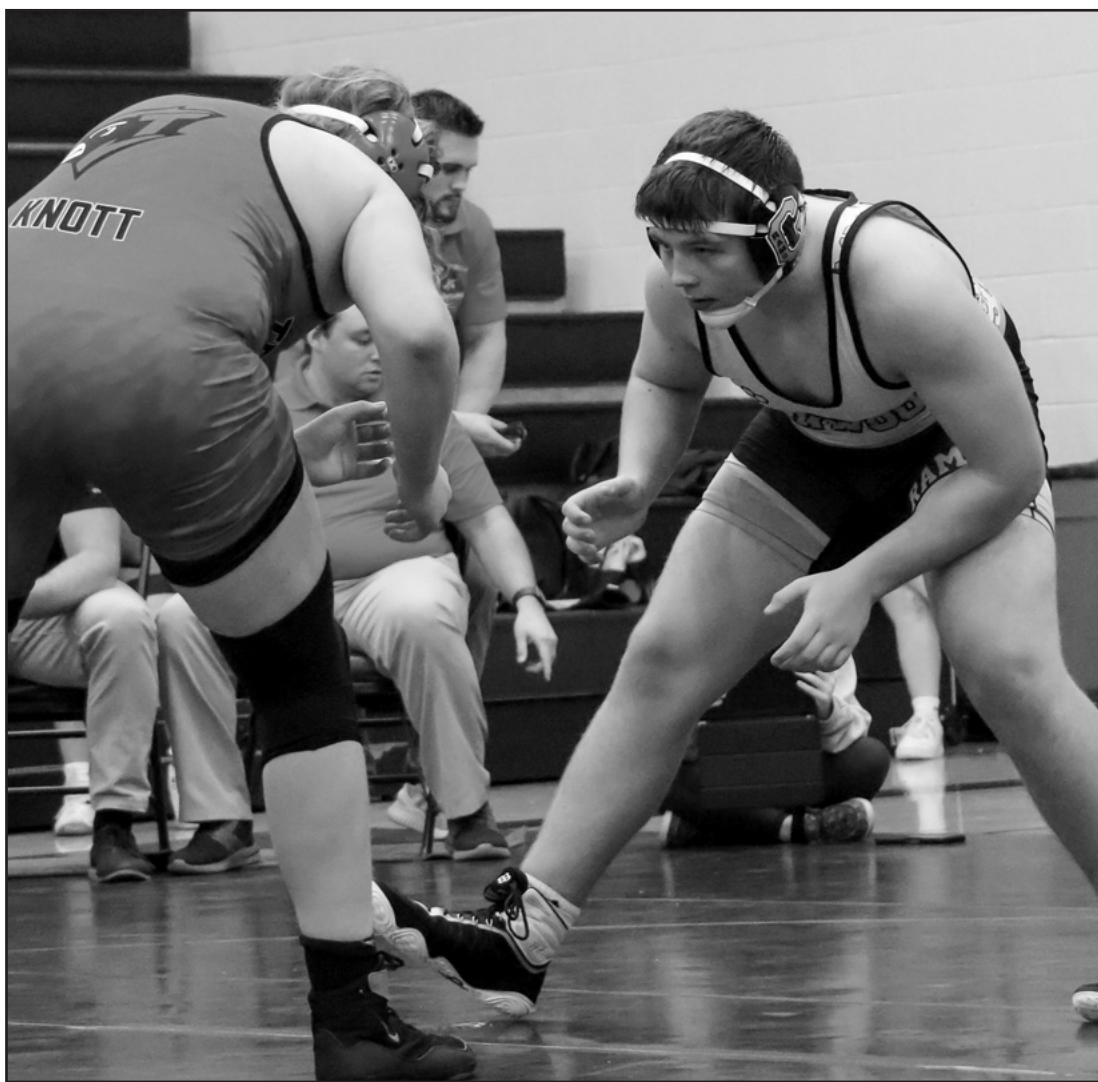
Rams 2-1 at home quad

Glenwood went 2-1 in its lone home dual meet of the season last Tuesday.

The Rams picked up a pair of wins over Treynor 54-24 and West Central Valley 47-21 before dropping a Hawkeye 10 Conference match to Creston in the nightcap, 45-27.

Creston finished off a perfect 3-0 night with a 45-27 dual win over Hawkeye Ten foe Glenwood Tuesday.

The Panthers swept their duals with a 68-6 victory over West Central Valley and a 63-15 win against Treynor. The Rams were dominant

in their first two dual victories, winning 13 matches by pin and two more by major decision. But against the Panthers, Glenwood dropped their first six matches – two by forfeit, two by fall – and dug themselves a 33-0 hole they could never get out of.

Glenwood responded with three straight victories from Reese Fauble (145 pounds), Tate Mayberry (152) and Kellan Scott (160) and by winning six of the final eight matches but it was too little too late.

"A couple things didn't go our way early, they got up early and then they got an upset win over Vinny (Mayberry) and that got them going," Weber said.

The Panthers' No. 9 ranked Christian Ahrens picked up perhaps the biggest win – and upset – of the night when he pinned the Rams' No. 2 ranked Mayberry in their

120-pound match.

Reese Fauble (145 pounds), Kellan Scott (160), C.J. Carter (195) and Mason Koehler (220) all won four matches on the night.

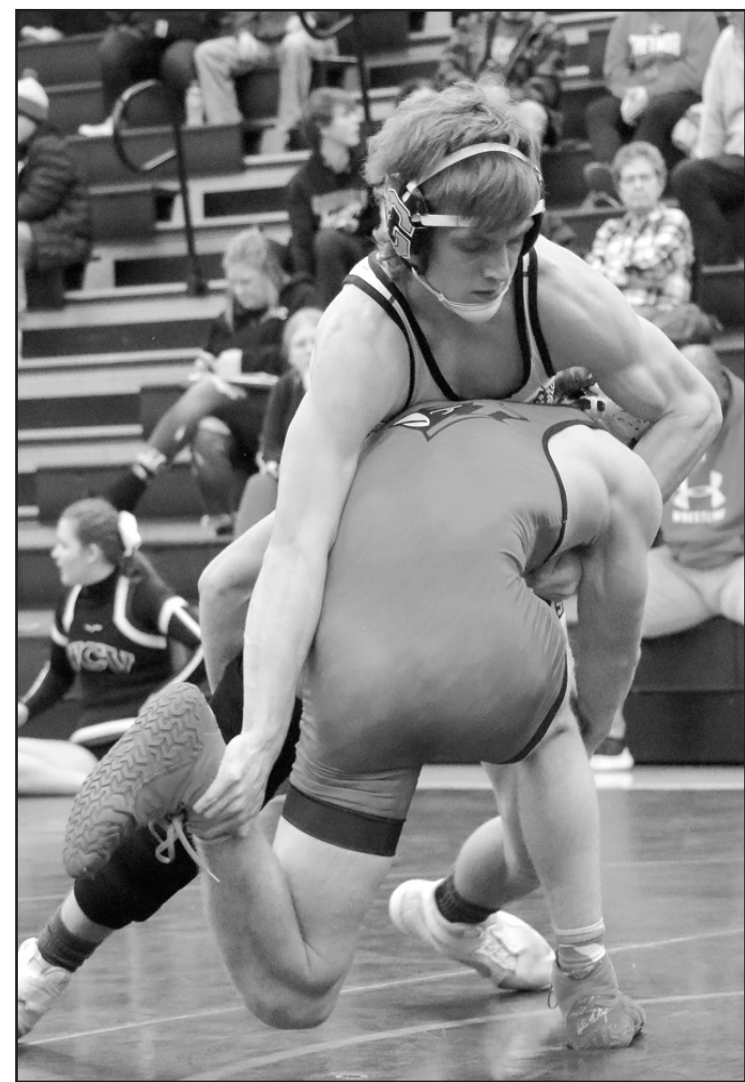
"I thought we finished the dual on a positive but as it's been all year, we need to get healthy," Weber said. "If we can get 14 guys out there healthy, we're going to be alright."

With the win over the Rams, coupled with last week's dual win over Atlantic, Creston sits in the drivers seat atop the Hawkeye 10 Conference standings.

"They're definitely the front runners, getting the dual wins over Atlantic and now us," Weber said of the Panthers. "But we're not going to stop wrestling. It's a long season and you never know what's going to happen. We'll see them again at the conference tournament."

Former Ram Sanders named to FCS All-American team

Three players who have led South Dakota State's strength in the trenches during the 2022 football season were honored last week on The Associated Press FCS All-America First Team presented by Regions Bank.

Jackrabbits made up 40 percent of the top offensive line as senior Grant Greenfield and Mason McCormick received first-team honors. On the other side of the ball, defensive tackle Caleb Sanders also earned first-team accolades.

Sanders, a 2018 Glenwood graduate, is a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision, has helped anchor the top rushing defense in the FCS ranks this season. The senior has registered 32 total tackles, including eight tackles for loss and six sacks.

With Greenfield at left tackle and McCormick manning the left guard spot, SDSU has averaged 33.0 points and 368.5 yards of total offense per game. A native of Rock Valley, Iowa, Greenfield also was a first-team All-America selection by the AP during the 2020-21 spring season.

In addition, Jackrabbit tight end Tucker Kraft was a third-team selection to the AP All-America squad. A junior from Timber Lake, Kraft has caught 21 passes for 249 yards and two touchdowns despite missing six games in the first half of the season due to injury. He was a second-team honoree by the AP during the 2021 cam-

court. That defensive intensity was often the Rams' best offense.

"When we were able to put some pressure on them, it caused them some problems," said Glenwood coach Brian Rasmussen. "That kind of got our offense going. We got a few transition buckets and started to see a few shots fall and things got going. But it definitely fed off our defense."

Rasmussen admitted his team did struggle in the halfcourt. The Rams scored just two points in the final five minutes of the first half, and they had trouble puncturing the Blue Devils' "box-and-one" defense designed to slow Hopp. But Glenwood did adjust. They outscored Plattsmouth 44-20 after halftime.

"We're going to face it pretty much every night and it's going to be a different one most every night, but I think we're equipped to deal with it," Rasmussen said of the variety of "junk defenses" his team has seen this season. "What's hard to transition is we've been accustomed to 60 some possessions a game and if we don't get those points off transition and our defense and we have to run a little offense, we're still learning how to slow it down and get the most out of that possession. We're not patient enough."

Hopp was a force all night for Glenwood, but especially in the second half. The Hawkeye 10 Conference's leading scorer, often facing triple teams every time she touched the ball, hit 13-of-21 shots and scored 20 of her 33 points after halftime. She also got her teammates involved, dishing out seven assists and grabbing 12 rebounds and four steals.

"She works so hard on the floor and off," Rasmussen said of Hopp. "She loves to see her teammates have success. So, it's not all
