The Rams' Scott (160 pounds), Carter (195) and Koehler (220) lost in their championship matches to finish as runners up.

Koehler, a freshman, gave three-time state qualifier Jaxson Hildebrand all he could handle in the 220-pound finals before losing 5-2.

"He gave him a run for his money so I look for him to keep getting better and better this year," Weber said.
